This week, School Council endorsed our new *Mobile Phone Policy*, which also includes devices such as smart watches. From the start of 2020, this is a requirement for all government schools. The policy means phones brought to school must be switched off and stored securely at the office during the school day. The new school policy, and the associated *Personal Property Policy*, can be found here. Thank you to those Year 5 and 6 students who provided their positive perspectives on these policies.

This newsletter contains a list of our **33 classes and their teachers for 2020**. Once again, we have considered teachers' requests, as well as ensuring each PLC team has a mix of experienced and newer to the profession teachers. Every level includes someone who has already worked in that team in 2019. Additionally, our Leading Teachers and Learning Specialists are spread throughout the school. We also ensure there are mentors for graduate teachers to support their career development.

We welcome some new teachers to Laburnum in 2020. Matthew Appleby, Matthew Arnott, Jana Loucas, Shazan Marikar, Chris Rodgers and Hillary Kerner have all been teaching in other schools. Arna Moore and Hannah Reynoldson will start their careers at LPS after working with us as preservice teachers this year.

In making these appointments, we are hiring an additional teacher for our extra class and also covering three staff who are taking leave for Semester One or longer.

All teachers will meet their classes on Tuesday 17 December. The staff induction program for new teachers also begins that day. All 2020 Year 1 - 6 teachers will be available after school on that day from 3:30 - 3:45pm in your child's 2020 classroom, should you wish to drop by and say hello. At 3:45pm, teachers will need to attend a staff meeting to handover student information to 2020 teachers, taking advantage of all our teachers being here on that day.

Class information will be sent home with your child on Tuesday 17 December.

As school recruitment continues over the holidays, parents are advised of the possibility that staffing may change by the time school resumes in January.




